In our ongoing efforts to improve communication between Church Council and our members, we will be writing a short blurb in each Grace Notes to highlight some of the activities that have taken place at our monthly meeting. Council minutes are available in the Member Section of our website and now will be posted on a bulletin board in the Narthex.

In February, Council brainstormed with Pastor Peterman on possible candidates for the important Transition Leadership Team. A wide cross section of candidates were discussed in order to achieve a diverse group of individuals that will work to develop a plan for our future. The entire congregation will have the opportunity to participate in this process as we move forward.

A newly formed Property Committee will be meeting in the near future to discuss maintenance and property issues. If you are interested in working with Council on this committee, please contact Bob Reilly.

Council received an update on the installation of the new AED (automated external defibrillator) system and discussed future trainings for ushers, greeters and other interested individuals. The AED, which is installed by the coat rack, has step by step instructions in the event this type of emergency arises.

An approval was granted to Grafton Electronic Design, LLC to begin installation of a sound system that will assist individual members of the congregation to better hear the service. Sermons will also be recorded so they can be shared with shut-ins or with individuals that have missed that service.

After each service there is a Council member that stands next to Pastor wishing you a great day. They are also there if you have any questions or comments. An added bonus is you get to know who your Council members are.

Finally there are many volunteer opportunities available at Grace. Do you have some time to help? These opportunities will be also be posted in the Narthex. Remember – "Many hands make light work." Peggy Schmidt, President

BOOKS FOR BABIES

For the third year the H3C, Hatfield Community Christian Coalition, is sponsoring a Book Drive, BOOKS FOR BABIES, from April 7th through Mother's Day, May 12th. All of the books collected will be delivered to Mitzvah Circle Foundation after Mother's Day. We are collecting new and gently used books for all ages of children and especially cardboard books for babies.

Mtizvah Circle Foundation meets critical needs of individuals and families who are struggling with crisis, poverty, homelessness and serious illness in our local neighborhoods. One of the projects they support is a Baby Diaper Supply Bag that includes diapers, baby wash, wipes and books for babies.

Mitzvah Circle Foundation sends a children's hard-backed cardboard book four times a year to the youngest children. They have discovered there is only one book for every 300 homes who are under the poverty line in America. Giving these books to the children in every Baby Diaper Supply Bag gets books into the hands of the most vulnerable children.

Mitzvah Circle Foundation need books for this very important mission and as well as books for all children and families in need that they serve.


