# Page 2 Council Corner; Snapshots from the Synod

#### **Council Corner**

The bulk of our work reviewed in April consisted of information discussed at the Property Management Committee meeting. Several items needed our attention such as the leaking windows in the Narthex, a plug for the heater and generator, a hot water issue in the kitchen and setting of the heater dial. The Committee continues to work on contacting and securing a contract to handle the rental properties.

A brief update was given on the staffing issues faced by Stepping Stones. It was exciting to learn that Stepping Stones will be celebrating 50 years this year. Under New Business, the Communication Team requested \$180 to make the Grace website secure. This would make it safer for members (member page password has changed) and visitors alike. A motion was made and passed. Also discussed was the use of the new bulletin board.

Other items reviewed included an update on the Transition Team, Pastor's report and our financials. A full copy of the minutes are posted on the website and on the bulletin board on the Narthex for your review.

#### **Snapshots from the Synod**

The first weekend in May, Bruce and I, along with Pastor Peterman, attended the Southeastern PA Synod. Since it was our first time attending this event, we arrived bright and early to attend the orientation and meet some of our fellow participants. We even reconnected with friends that we have not seen in a while. The days consisted of joyful worship, procedural items such as numerous voting opportunities for Synod representatives, votes on two resolutions (lobbying for immigration and an Earth agenda) and reports on the status of the churches and other Synod related items.

What we both found to be the most beneficial is the networking and the "Holy Huddles" where we had a chance to talk with other church representatives about their challenges. Some of the churches we spoke to have congregants that drive 30 minutes to 45 minutes to their services. Compare how different that is at Grace where in many cases we can walk to ours. An advantage for Grace is the number of outreach activities that we have. But we picked up even more ideas on how to improve attendance at the activities and at our services. Did you know that we really should be promoting our Christmas services ten weeks in advance? People are already making their holiday plans then and we want to be a

part of it.

We also spent some time talking with Synod representatives about the "Forward Together in Faith" grant. This is something we plan on applying for, so stayed tuned to hear our action plan on that. And we even came up with a new program that we can use for a Stitchers' event.

It was an interesting and long weekend, filled with ideas that hopefully we can use as we go through our transition period and beyond!

## From the Minister of Music; Thanks

Therefore Let us go toward perfection. Hebrews 6:1

Whether our choir meets on a week night or at 9:20 Sunday Morning, we need to practice the music we will be singing. Rehearsal is sometimes painstaking work and may even sometimes seem tedious. The French word for rehearsal, *repetition*, sometimes seems all too appropriate. In choir practice, we are likely to repeat difficult passages many times in order to master our music.

A commitment to attending rehearsals might mean missing something else. But if we assume that because we know the music, we don't need to practice, we are thinking as individuals and not as members of a unified body that needs all its parts.....soprano, alto, tenor, and bass....to produce its sound. Rehearsal reminds us of the integral connection between discipline and freedom.

I've often noticed the similarities between rehearsal and prayer. We may be tempted, for a variety of reasons, to skip prayer. Sometimes when we pray, it seems tedious. However, if we persevere, something begins to happen. For just as rehearsal is not an end in itself but a preparation for singing God's praises in worship, our prayer time is not a goal but a preparation. Don't you wish you could sing in the choir? You can you know.
