A Letter from the Pastor

Dear Friends at Grace,

In mid-December, just as the Christmas rush came barreling down, I received a lovely little note in the mail with a check. Vicki Trueman wrote on behalf of her brother, (Byron) Donald Rector, who used to attend Grace when he was well enough to do so, to let us know that he had died this year, on June 24th. She reports that he was very fond of Grace, and that when he was no longer able to drive, some members of Grace gave him rides to church every week. He lived on Maple Avenue in Hatfield. Frank Stone also remembers helping him when he needed to move into an apartment at Derstine Run. When things became more difficult for him, he attended worship there.

Vicki also reported that Donald didn't have much left at the end, but that she was honoring his wishes as expressed in his will by sending Grace 1/4 of his estate as a donation to Grace's ministry. The check enclosed was for \$285. On the one hand, it is a fairly small check, given Grace's end of the year needs. On the other, given that it was one quarter of all that he had left in the world at his death, it was enormously generous! What a moving testament to Grace's ministry of caring!

The letter warmed my heart, though, in another way. The transition workshops of the fall had helped us surface four (4) mission priorities for Grace for this next phase of Grace's life and ministry, and we are working on a 3-year mission plan (2020-2022) based on these 4 priorities. The four are:

- 4) Sunday School, VBS, Stepping Stones: Children & Families of Grace and the Community (includes both the children and families we already have and building and re-building relationships, especially with Stepping Stones families and staff)

Vicki's letter echoes how important the fellowship, warmth and welcome of Grace are, and how good Grace folks are in reaching out to stay connected when people become ill or have trouble coming to worship. It's a moment of pride for us, to know who we are, and who we are called out to be. Palm into Ashes

There's a flow to the liturgical year that we feel sometimes in the scripture readings, how they relate to one another and move through the year. Sometimes we can notice that flow in another way. This year's ashes are made from last year's palm.

It's possible to buy ash already prepared, and palm needs to be burned outside using a very hot fire (The palm is string-y and hard to burn, even when quite dry). This year, we'll be gathering last year's palm – and any other older palm you've had sitting around – during the month of February, from 2/2 through 2/23, when we'll burn it to make the ashes for this year's Ash Wednesday. Bring it with you to worship and place it in the basket with the other palm.

Based on the Hebrew word, hallelu yah, meaning "Praise the Lord," Alleluia has been a word of great praise to God in the life of the church and was prominent in early Christian liturgies. Because of the penitential character of the season of Lent in the Western church, singing or saying the word "alleluia" has historically been suspended during Lent's forty days. This period of individual and congregational reflection on the quality of our baptismal faith and life suggests that the joyful nature of alleluia is more appropriately reserved for our Easter celebrations when it is given full and jubilant voice.

We invite children and the congregation to color an Alleluia and place it in the box, and on Transfiguration Sunday they will be "Locked UP!" BOOM.

The treasure chest will remain near the pulpit. Then on Easter Sunday these Alleluias will be released and hung up all over the church and we then can sing and shout Alleluia with much joy and gusto!


