At our January Council meeting, we began our preparations for selecting a Call Committee, the next step in the process of calling a new Pastor. The process, much like the selection of the Transition Team, takes a lot of thought as we hope to select members that represent Grace as a whole. While it will require significant work over the summer, the end result will be a new Pastor to lead us in the fall.

As I am writing this, once again another unexpected challenge, has provided us with a bump in the road. Last week, Council, Pastor and I had to make the difficult decision to cancel services for March 15th and 22nd and the Lenten service to be hosted by Grace on March 18th. In addition all committee meetings and activities were canceled through March 27th. That means the March Council meeting and the special Council meeting to review and discuss the materials from the discussions on homosexuality had to be postponed. It will push our process back again, but hopefully not by too much. But the health of our members and the greater community at large is too important to risk.

Look forward to hearing more about the upcoming weeks from Pastor Peterman and our church council as we take time in this rest to come together in prayer, the Word, music, and every blessing you find each day. I know your hearts and prayers for each other mean a lot to the Grace Church family. Be strong, be healthy and wait for the Lord. "Eye has not seen, ear has not heard, what God has ready for those who love him"

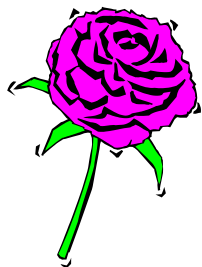

Rice Bowl Project continues through Palm Sunday, April 5th

During each Sunday in Lent a special offering is observed for the Rice Bowl. These gifts provide food for many in our neighborhood as well as around the world. **In your offering envelope box, special envelopes are provided for each of the six Sundays in Lent.**

Our gifts will be shared the following organizations:

The **Hatfield Food Cupboard** located at Emmanuel Evangelical Congregational Church provides food to all residents in the Hatfield Borough and Hatfield Township. The Food Cupboard offers staple non-perishable food, baked goods, produce, frozen meat, basic paper and laundry products as well as basic personal care products, when available. When supplies run low, the Food Cupboard may need to purchase items to fill the needs of our local families. Our Rice Bowl gifts help to supplement these items.

Manna on Main Street in Lansdale provides meals for the homeless and those in need. They provide a free 12-week training program in culinary arts, life and work skills helping individuals regain economic stability. As of February 2020, Manna began providing the Montgomery County Senior Adult Activities Center daily group meals and Meals On Wheels programs in Norristown, Glenside and Ambler. Manna is receiving support from Generations of Indian Valley--provider of Meals on Wheels to Indian Valley and North Penn regions. Through this contract, Manna is serving meals to over 600 Montgomery County seniors.

Your gifts to **World Hunger** can help reach communities most in need throughout the world. Working through **ELCA congregations and our global companion churches, the ELCA reaches more places effectively than we could ever do alone. In addition to funding relief and development projects, the ELCA helps change systems that perpetuate poverty.** They are positioned to reach communities in need. 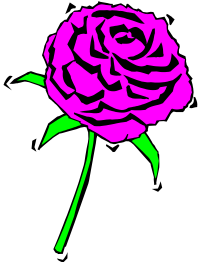
INreach Information and Updates
