Making Masks

Grace members and friends have responded with Amazing Grace to Lou Farrell's challenge to us, preparing **217 sandwiches last week** for members of the Welcome Church and others living on the streets of Philadelphia. The programs who received the sandwiches were overjoyed! They were all gone by dinnertime. Wednesday is a sparse day. The food is really needed.

Not all of us can make sandwiches each week, but some of us can, so we will continue making sandwiches until the usual feeding programs reopen, then will re-evaluate. Members of St. John's Ambler are joining us in this feeding effort.

Needed on loan: a larger cooler to keep at the church on Tuesdays to receive the sandwiches. (contact Lou if you have one we can use) *Want to help?*

- You make peanut butter and jelly sandwiches on white bread and put them in ZIPLOC bags, 1 sandwich per bag. Use cheap white bread with gobs of PB and J. A loaf will get you nine sandwiches. Please consider buying two loaves.
- Make the kind of sandwiches that your Mom used to yell at you about. Load them up. We want to fill bellies.
- The cooler will be at the entrance to Grace all day each TUESDAY. Leave your donation in the labeled cooler sometime between 8:00 am and 8:00 pm
- Please email, text or call Lou to let him know how many sandwiches you made. He delivers Wednesday.

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Food Needed at EEC's Food Pantry

Many thanks for your continued generosity for the people of our community who are hungry and unable to feed their families. There are marked covered bins outside Grace's main entrance doors (Stepping Stones entrance) where you can leave items as you are able. We take them to EEC's food cupboard. Please consider picking up these kinds of staples when you re-supply your home.

High priority items (we will update as we can):

- · Boxed Plain Pasta
- · 1-2 lb. bags plain white rice (**not** "Minute")
- · Tomato Soup including low sodium variety
- · Canned olives, mushrooms, spinach, beets
- · Garbanzo beans (chickpeas)
- · Tuna in OIL
- · Peanut Butter, jelly
- Canned meat and beef stew
- · Canned fruit or applesauce Large size
- 100% fruit juice
- Toilet paper (individually wrapped), paper towels, tissues
- · toothpaste
- · Laundry detergent
- · Body & hand wash
- · Cake mix and icing parings
- · Pancake mix / pancake syrup
