A Letter from the Pastor

Come and see. Where we are going will become clearer as we go.

I'd rather have a more fixed sense of our plans. We did have more fixed plans, and would be well on our way in the call process by now, but Covid has interrupted those plans.

We pause to give thanks to God for how well we have been able to bring worship online, to stay connected through a Zoom Sunday School and Council meetings, to secure a Payroll Protection Program loan and restart Stepping Stones day care, and begin a new (hugely successful) PB & J sandwich ministry, in addition to stepping up support for the community food cupboard at EEC. We are grateful for each of you who has given life and breath to any of these parts of Grace's ministry over the last three months. Thank you.

Now we take a small next step toward returning to gathering in person as a community – but in ways that we can consciously care for and protect each other until a vaccine arrives, or until there is clearer direction about safety. While in the Green phase, which begins June 26th, we will still be allowed only 50 people at any one time, with

SEPA Counties Set to Go Green

Our suburban counties are set to enter the "Green" phase of reopening on Friday, June 26. Philadelphia is expected to follow by early July.

The "Green" phase is <u>not</u> a return to pre-pandemic normals. Organizations must still follow practices for **wearing masks**, **maintaining physical distancing**, and **disinfecting public spaces**.

"I remind our churches to follow a slow, cautious and deliberate process while moving toward reopening," says Bishop Patricia A. Davenport. "As the church our chief concern is for the health of our members, staff, and rostered ministers, and the people in our communities who would be affected by increased community spread - particularly those who are elderly or vulnerable to COVID-19."

PB & J Sandwich Update: Welcome Bread

We are still making PB & J and Tuesday is still our day!

Here's an update from the Jelly Czar:

After two weeks, we are back on track. Let me tell you what has been happening. Initially, we were working only with Project HOME in Philadelphia, partnering with them as our distribution partner. Since the situation in the city has changed, they need fewer sandwiches. That led to some serious scrambling on my part to find new groups who can get our sandwiches and snack bags out to the street.

It took a bit of work, but I'm happy to say that we have added four different distributors who are able to get our sandwiches to hungry folks in Montgomery, Delaware and Philadelphia counties. We have leveled out at about 2000 sandwiches a week and could probably grow that. I do a good part of the driving for pickups and am happy that Barry is able to pick up the slack, getting food to Project HOME on Wednesday. The Welcome Bread Facebook page has the most current information.

We have good partners and you should feel confident that your work is getting to people who need it. Please check in if you have any questions and keep up the valuable work that you are doing.

EEC Food Cupboard Collection continues...

Thank you so much for your generous contributions (dropped off in the plastic food bins under the portico at Grace)! Like the rest of the country, many Hatfield residents have really struggled to find enough money to put food on their table and pay for household items during this ongoing pandemic and your donations have been a huge blessing. They will continue to be essential during the summer months as the number of clients continue to grow at our local food cupboards. Any additional items you can pick up while you shop will make a difference, including grocery store gift cards. All non-perishables and household items are helpful.

The latest wish list from EEC is: Chunky soup (esp. "Heart healthy") and "other " soups such as clam chowder, split pea, lentil, black bean, vegetable. Also canned olives, spinach, asparagus, mushrooms, tuna in oil, salad dressing, 100% juice, and grocery gift cards. Updated wish lists for scarce items will be shared in Grace notes.

Distributions are held 4 times a month on the 1st Tuesday at 5:30 pm, 2nd Thursday at 1 pm, 3rd Wednesday at 5:30 pm, and 4th Thursday at 1 pm. All donated items at Grace are brought to the EEC Food Cupboard once a week (usually Tuesday or Wednesday). The food cupboard is available to all Hatfield borough residents, so please reach out if you or someone you know would benefit from receiving supplemental food pantry items.

Janet Hague has also informed us that your garden surplus is welcomed and greatly appreciated by their clients! If you have garden perishables that you would like to share, please call Carol and we can set up a time for pick up.
