

### A Letter from the Pastor

Yet with the first anniversary of the lockdown now so clearly in view, I often find myself wondering:



I invite you to find a way to observe Lent as a way to structure your time, even your personal space, to make these 40 days a time apart. Your Grace family offers you some Cont.

resources.

Our theme for this Lent will be *The Spiritual Gifts of Waiting*.

Kevin and I will post a weekly Prayer Pause on Wednesdays each week of Lent. We'll post on both the church's and the school's Facebook pages, on the church website, and have print copies of the set of postings available at church and in the packets going out to homebound members and others quarantining right now. Each Prayer Pause will be simple: a photo; a scripture verse; a few thoughts in meditation; a verse of a hymn.

You may use the *Prayer Pause* materials in any way that works for you. These suggestions may be helpful:

Choose a prayer partner for the set to combat somebody's loneliness – your own or someone else's. (It's also fine to use the material by yourself, or with members of your own household.)

**Set aside a place** in your home where you are free from distractions. Use that place for the weekly Prayer Pause materials on Wednesdays. Or check in with your place often to sit quietly, offer a prayer – it can be as simple as "Thank you, God, for this day" or a praying of the Lord's prayer. Some people find simple deep breaths, a kind of cleansing prayer, easier or better than trying to find the right words. Others need to move when they pray, like going for a walk or a run. Find what works best for you.

Set aside a time for prayer, meditation or reflection

Choose a special offering for the season of Lent, whether it is a gift of your time, your resources, or work on a specific task. Grace gathers offerings for Rice Bowl in Lent (hunger offerings; see page12 in this *Parish News*). Grace supports two feeding ministries (pb & j sandwiches on Tuesdays; support for EEC's food cupboard, ongoing). Lenten midweek offerings have typically supported the Hatfield Pastors' Fund for people in our community with emergency needs.

**Connect with someone** who would strengthen your spirit.

Be encouraged!

Even the ashes we wear are in the sign of the cross: Everything we do as Christians reminds us God takes the most difficult circumstances of our



**Note:** INreach and Pastor Peterman are working to create guidelines for our prayer lists, so we'll have ways both of adding people to them, and of taking people off of them, as appropriate. We've had the pattern in the past of adding people on and not checking back, so sometimes the person has long been healed, or has died, and we keep praying, as though nothing has happened...

For now, INreach has proposed, and Council has agreed, that when a member of Grace dies, or a loved one of someone at Grace dies and would like the family and friends to be remembered in prayer, that we will hold them publicly in prayer for 3 months together, then their names will cycle off.

We know that grieving takes longer than 3 months! Our Sunday prayers often mention those who are grieving, though often not by name unless there's been a recent death; we highlight those who are grieving on All Saints Sunday, among others, at our annual meeting, when we remember members who were lost in the past year, and on other special occasions. We invite you to bring all your requests to God in prayer!

Dear Sponsors,

This certainly is and continues to be a year of challenges. The Hatfield Christmas Committee needed to restructure the entire process of helping to serve the needy of our Hatfield Community. We needed to find a different means to support these parents at Christmas for their children.

We asked for your help to create a different procedure, and your support was immediate and overwhelming. We opted to follow the guidelines of Manna on Main Street and only give gift cards, three per child, rather than actual gifts. With the Covid Pandemic it was not safe to ask our volunteers to shop in person.

With your help, we gave gift cards to 100 children in 80 families. We partnered primarily with the two local food cupboards, Emmanuel EC Church and Hatfield Church of the Brethren.

We can't thank you enough for donating to the gift card campaign and donations for personal hygiene items. In the midst of so many changes in our community, you not only met these new challenges but exceeded all expectations.

### Rice Bowl Project Continues through Palm Sunday, March 28<sup>th</sup>

What is the Rice Bowl? During each Sunday in Lent a special offering is observed for the Rice Bowl. These gifts provide food for many in our neighborhood as well as around the world. In your offering envelope box, special envelopes are provided for each of the six Sundays in Lent.

Our gifts will be shared with three organizations. The first is the **Hatfield Food Cupboard** at Emmanuel Evangelical Congregational Church which provides food to those in need in the Hatfield area. The second organization is **Manna on Main Street** in Lansdale which provides food and hot meals for those in the Lansdale area. ### Page 14 Message from SEPA Synod Secretary



Grace and peace from Jesus Christ, the redeemer of the world.

I am Pastor Karl Richard, Secretary of the Southeastern Pennsylvania Synod of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America.

I was horrified by the events that took place in Washington DC on January 6<sup>th</sup> when armed rioters stormed the capitol building in an attempt to overturn the election. It made me ask, "Is this who we are as a nation? As a society?"

What I have had to acknowledge, to my despair, is that the answer is "Yes, this is who we are." It is not all of who we are. It is not the best of who we are. But it is decidedly too large a part of who we are as a nation, as a society.

We cannot say "this is not us." One of those arrested is a firefighter from Southeastern Pennsylvania. Another, who is alleged to have planned to sell the computer of the Speaker of the House to Russian operatives, has been arraigned in Harrisburg.

It was on the Feast of the Epiphany – the day we celebrate the revelation of the Light of God's love for all people through Jesus Christ – that this band of rioters stormed the Capitol. Many bore symbols of the Confederacy, which are symbols of hate to our siblings of color. Others wore clothes which showed support of Nazi death camps and Jewish extermination.

They were led by white nationalists and white supremacists, who brought a violent insurrection against the sitting, elected government of the United States.

We are far from the dream the Reverend Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. envisioned, where "the sons of former slaves and the sons of former slave-owners will be able to sit down together at the table of brotherhood."

They did not prevail. On January 20<sup>th</sup> we witnessed the inauguration of a new president.

But for us to live in peace with one another there needs to be more

than a transition from one leader to another. There needs to be acknowledgment of wrongs that have been done. There needs to be accountability. There needs to be repentance before there can be reconciliation.

We as a nation "hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal." This is an essential part of our national creed. Another part of this creed is the provision that all people be afforded "equal justice under the law."

We as a nation need to acknowledge that we do not recognize all people as equal. We do not allow all people equal access to society, or equal protection under the law. And we as Christians, particularly we Christians who are white, need to recognize that this is not just a violation of our national creed, but of our call and faith as people of God in Christ.

As the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America we have declared that white supremacy is racism and we condemn it; the love of God is for all people, without exception, and we proclaim it.

Jesus did not kill those who disagreed with him. He died for them. He did not come to save only those who were like him. He came to offer salvation to all. As we read in John 3:16, "God so loved the WORLD that he gave his only begotten Son..."

As we move into this new administration, let us be people who affirm the truth of both our Christian Creed that God loves the world, and our national creed that all people are created equal. Let us pray for peace, and let us *act* for peace. Let us stand for and with the oppressed. Let us root out the oppressor within us, and stand against those who would oppress others. Let us acknowledge our wrongs and repent of them, so that true reconciliation can happen. Let us follow the Spirit of Christ to embody the dream of Dr. King. Let us, with God's help, become the Beloved Community God intends us to be. And may *this* be who we are as a nation, and as a society.
