Volunteers are NEEDED! There is so much that needs to be done, but, please know that if you can spare an hour or two each month to help out, social distancing measures and strong COVID protocols are in place for everyone's protection.

- \Rightarrow No customers are allowed inside the building
- ⇒ Customers call to get their place in line and an sheet and clipboard is brought to their car for them to complete
- ⇒ All volunteers wear masks, use hand sanitizer regularly, and wipe down surfaces with disinfectant
- ⇒ Volunteers can choose to do any of the following: fill orders, weigh items, take groceries out to customer's cars, or just stock the shelves.
