Romans 10:5-17

Moses writes about the righteousness that is based on the law, that the person who does the commandments shall live by them. ⁶But the righteousness based on faith says, “Do not say in your heart, ‘Who will ascend into heaven?’” (that is, to bring Christ down) ⁷“or ‘Who will descend into the abyss?’” (that is, to bring Christ up

from the dead). ⁸ But what does it say? “The word is near you, in your mouth and in your heart” (that is, the word of faith that we proclaim); ⁹ because, if you confess with your mouth that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. ¹⁰ For with the heart one believes and is justified, and with the mouth one confesses and is saved. ¹¹ For the Scripture says, “Everyone who believes in him will not be put to shame.” ¹² For there is no distinction between Jew and Greek; for the same Lord is Lord of all, bestowing his riches on all who call on him. ¹³ For “everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved.”

¹⁴ How then will they call on him in whom they have not believed? And how are they to believe in him of whom they have never heard? ¹⁵ And how are they to hear without someone preaching? ¹⁶ And how are they to preach unless they are sent? As it is written, “How beautiful are the feet of those who preach the good news!” ¹⁷ So faith comes from hearing, and hearing through the word of Christ.

INSTALLATION

Presentation

The assembly stands.

The pastor being installed and the council president come forward.

The presiding minister addresses the assembly.

Having been authorized by the church to install Nancy Elizabeth Miller Raabe, our co-worker in the gospel, as Pastor of Grace Lutheran Church, I now ask for certification of this call.

The council president addresses the presiding minister.

After prayerful deliberation, we, of Grace Lutheran Church Hatfield, have called Nancy Elizabeth Miller Raabe to serve as a minister of word and sacrament in the position of Pastor.

I present Nancy Raabe and this letter certifying the call.

The council president gives the presiding minister the letter certifying that the call has been received and accepted.

The assembly is seated.

Address and Questions

The readers address the minister of word and sacrament.

Peggy Schmidt, Council President: *A reading from John:* Jesus said, “Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you. Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained.” (*John 20:21-23*)

Tom Salter, Call Committee member: *A reading from Matthew:* Jesus said, “All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you. And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age.” (*Matthew 28:18-20*)

Laura Slugg, congregation member: *A reading from First Timothy:* Set the believers an example in speech and conduct, in love, in faith, in purity. Attend to the public reading of scripture, to exhorting, to teaching. Do not neglect the gift that is in you, but put these things into practice, devote yourself to them, so that all may see your progress. Pay close attention to yourself and to your teaching; continue in these things, for in doing this you will save both yourself and your hearers. (1 Timothy 4:12-16)

The presiding minister addresses questions to the minister of word and sacrament.

Response: I will, and I ask God to help me.

will you love, serve, and pray for God's people,
nourish them with the word and sacraments,
and lead them by your own example in faithful service and holy living?

Response: I will, and I ask God to help me.

Will you give faithful witness in the world,
that God's love may be known in all that you do?

Response: I will, and I ask God to help me.

Almighty God, who has given you the will to do these things,
graciously give you the strength and compassion to perform them.

The assembly responds: Amen.

Blessing

The newly installed pastor may kneel as the presiding minister proclaims God's blessing.

The God of peace, who brought us again from the dead by the blood of the eternal
covenant, through our Lord Jesus, the great shepherd of the sheep, make you
complete in everything good, so that you may do God's will, working in you that
which is pleasing in God's sight; through Jesus Christ, to whom be the glory forever
and ever. **Amen.**

The pastor stands. The presiding minister escorts the pastor to the place of baptism.

A representative of the congregation, Council member Carol MacDonald, hands the pastor a vessel of water and says: You have been called to be among us to baptize. Here is water which symbolizes God's gift of belonging in Christ.

People: There is one Lord, one faith, one baptism, one God and Father of us all.

They proceed to the place of the word. A representative of the congregation, Robert Reilly, Call Committee Chair, hands the pastor a Bible and says:

You have been called to be among us to proclaim the good news of Christ. Here are the scriptures that express this call.

People: Thanks be to God for the good news of Christ.

They proceed to the place of the meal. A representative of the congregation, Jean Shaffer, Grace Music and Giving ministries, hands the pastor a chalice and says:

You have been called to be among us to lead worship and preside at the Lord's supper. Receive now this chalice as a symbol of our worship life.

People: Taste and see that the Lord is good.

They proceed to the midst of the congregation. A confirmation student of the congregation, Elijah Krout, hands the pastor Luther's Small Catechism and says:

You have been called to be among us to teach God's Word. Receive now this catechism which represents this call.

People: Thanks be to God for the life-giving Word.

The presiding minister addresses the assembly.

People of God, I present to you Pastor Nancy Raabe.

Let us welcome Pastor Raabe in the name of Christ.

The assembly may offer acclamation with applause.


The service continues with the prayers of intercession, with Pastor Raabe now the presiding minister. Prayers are included for the newly installed pastor, all ministries in the church, and all Christians in their vocations.


