From Pastor Raabe

Liturgy is Life

Our family enjoys the show “Ted Lasso,” about an American soccer coach with heart who finds himself plunged in the cutthroat world of British soccer (football). Coach Lasso’s team is filled with quirky characters, one of whom, Dani Rojas, lives for the sheer joy of the game and loves to shout, “Football is life!” (Spoiler alert...until, that is, the team dog jumps in front of one of Dani’s penalty kicks and is instantly killed, after which Dani’s shout turns into a lament: “Football is death.” Dani’s joy returns when the team finally convinces him it wasn’t his fault.)



In that same spirit, I’d like you to know that “Liturgy is life!” Liturgy is what we do in worship. And it is life-giving.

The original Greek word actually means “the work of the people.” If that sounds dull, the same thing week in and week out, it is anything but. In fact, liturgical worship is a great drama that it is our delight to freshly re-enact every time we come to church. The rhythm of our worship is from God to us, and then from us back to God. We acknowledge God’s abundant gifts and receive them together, as one body, as we re-tell every week the entire story of what it means to be a Christian, with our focus always on Christ. We build one another up as we speak to one another in psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs. And we return these gifts joyfully to God in worship and in the service that flows naturally from it.

Of the four major parts of our liturgy, the Kyrie (“Lord, have

mercy”) is the first prayer of the gathered congregation. Here we voice our emptiness and our need for God to be present and fill us with God’s grace. In the Gloria (“Glory to God”) we praise and thank God for the gift of God’s Son. In the Sanctus (“Holy, holy”) we acknowledge God’s holiness and shout hosannas for the coming of Christ into our midst. In the Agnus Dei (“Lamb of God”) we honor the accomplishment of Christ’s death in removing the world’s sin.

And of course there are many other parts of the liturgy—the Gospel Acclamation, the Peace, the Offertory, the Lord’s Prayer and the Blessing. You may be amazed (OK, maybe not amazed...but I was when I first discovered this!) to know that every single part of our liturgy is drawn directly from scripture. If you go to our web site at <https://gracelutheranhatfield.org/learn-and-grow/bible-study-resources/> you will find a complete set of Bible verse attributions for our entire worship life.

Here at Grace we are gradually restoring the major pieces of the liturgy to our service. We already had the Lamb of God on communion Sundays. Now we have brought back the Gloria in the form of a lively hymn from Luther’s time, “All Glory Be to God on High” (ELW 410), whose tune is actually a Renaissance dance. In Advent we’ll exchange the Gloria for the Kyrie, and soon I hope we will be seeing the “Holy, holy” as part of our communion liturgy.

I am particularly looking forward to the latter, because our acknowledgment of God’s holiness inspires in us a corresponding awareness of how we, too, are a holy people. The classic Old Testament understanding of God’s holiness was as the One who is different, who is set apart in a way that mortals may not perceive; even the seraphs in Isaiah’s great vision of God in Isaiah 6 cannot even look upon God, and cover their faces with their wings as they circle God’s throne.

But Leviticus 19:2 God tells the people of Israel, “You shall be holy, for I the LORD your God am holy.” In what way are we holy—set apart? In that we are in the world but not of the world. As Jesus says in his great prayer to his Father in John 17:14, “they do not belong to the world, just as I do not belong to the world.” Our worship not only builds up our faith but it reminds us that we are called to holiness in life through the movement that flows from our relationship with Christ and is nourished in worship.

Just as we do not know what each day will bring, only God knows what

new life we will discover each week in worship. Liturgy is life! Come and see!

Whatever the case may be, new and refreshing looks and feels great! (Especially after COVID sheltering).



Well, how does a music ministry get a haircut? Well of course it doesn't really get a haircut, but there's a lot I'm doing to make us look and feel great! As you can imagine, there's always something to clean up, organize, copy, order, compose, coordinate, etc. But there is also that thing called PRACTICE. It takes a huge amount of effort to get to the point where we are practicing music. All the preparatory work takes a while and because we are a “liturgical” church, we plan around scripture and dynamics of worship content. That is to say that every hair, I mean, every word or theme is connected and that takes time to make all things come together. I want our music ministry to feel new and refreshing.

Here are some things I've been working on having part of music this Fall to look forward to:

- *Hymn preludes for piano and guitar in a light jazz and gospel style*
- *Choir anthems, new and familiar sung choral benedictions such as Peter Lutkin's "The Lord Bless You and Keep You"*
- *Beautiful vocal solos*
- *Songs led by choir that invite the congregation to join along*
- *Singing the psalms in worship: (Intended to be sung, we have Psalm Leaders each week now helping with this very important ministry role. Thank you to Pastor Raabe for her inspiration to do this. Both Pastor and I have both spent a lot of time on psalmody to include and compose music refrains for many of the psalms we are now singing.)*
- *Variety: Spirituals, gospel hymns (old style hymns), praise songs, traditional hymns, hymns that unite us and offer comfort, heartfelt hymns*
- *Harold Schaefer and I are coordinating together to share a mix of music for Communion Sundays for preludes and Communion music.*

I hope that each of you are finding worship to be a most prayerful and meaningful experience and that music inspires you to sing along. I am blessed to be your Minister of Music.

On a special note: If you're free on November 16th at 12noon...Come listen, I have been invited to play an organ recital at St John UCC Church in Lansdale (500 Main Street, with parking on the street or church parking lot). I am delighted to have been asked to play as part of a series of concerts sponsored by the American Guild of Organists. The programs are 30 minutes in length and are free and open to the public.

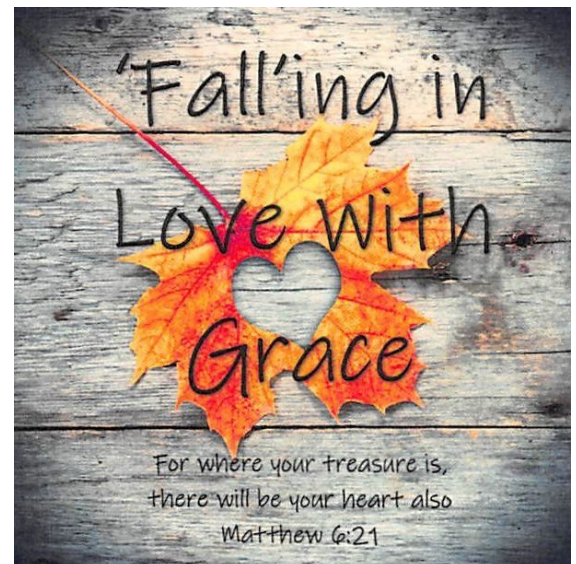
For where your treasure is, there will be your heart also. (Matthew 6:21)
