By the mercy of God

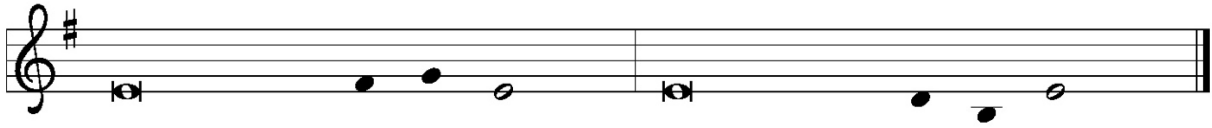
we are united with Jesus Christ,

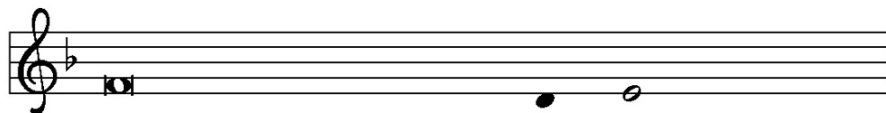
## Prayers



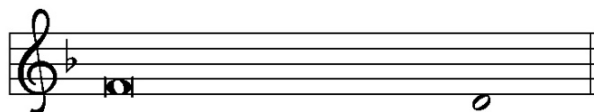
Hear my prayer, O Lord; **listen to my cry.**



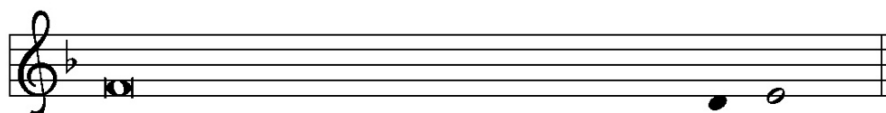
Keep me as the apple of your eye;
