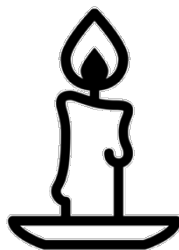

## CONFESSION AND FORGIVENESS

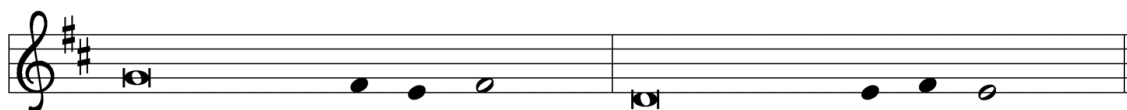
Let us confess our sin in the presence of God and of one another.
