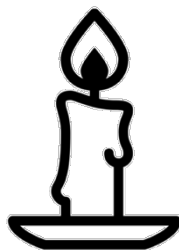



**Reading: Jeremiah 14:9**


