^{2:18}I hated all my toil in which I had toiled under the sun, seeing that I must leave it





Postlude: Lift High the Cross Arr. Donald Busarow

The Virtual Pipe Organ heard in today's worship service is the Organ of the First Lutheran Church of Long Beach, California. Completed in 1976 by the W. Zimmer and Sons Organ Company from Charlotte, NC. This instrument was built around the time when there was reformation of American organ building tonal concepts. The sound of organs had become symphonic in their tonal schemes, but the reformation sought to bring back the brighter and clear tonalities of the Baroque era. This instrument represents some of the tonal concepts of the organ reformation but also retains some character of the Romantic Symphonic qualities. The audio samples are produced by the American company, Evensong Music Company, who records and produces organ sample sets of American Organs. The sounds of this pipe organ are played in combination with our Allen Protégé Organ.
