


First Reading: Genesis 15:1-6

Second Reading: Hebrews 11:1-3, 8-16

¹Now faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen. ²Indeed, by faith our ancestors received approval. ³By faith we understand that the worlds were prepared by the word of God, so that what is seen was made from things that are not visible.

⁸By faith Abraham obeyed when he was called to set out for a place that he was to receive as an inheritance; and he set out, not knowing where he was going. ⁹By faith he stayed for a time in the land he had been promised, as in a foreign land, living in tents, as did Isaac and Jacob, who were heirs with him of the same promise. ¹⁰For he looked forward to the city that has foundations, whose architect and builder is God. ¹¹By faith he received power of procreation, even though he was too old—and Sarah herself was barren—because he considered him faithful who had promised. ¹²Therefore from one person, and this one as good as dead, descendants were born, "as many as the stars of heaven and as the innumerable grains of sand by the seashore."

¹³All of these died in faith without having received the promises, but from a distance they saw and greeted them. They confessed that they were strangers and foreigners on the earth, ¹⁴for people who speak in this way make it clear that they are seeking a homeland. ¹⁵If they had been thinking of the land that they had left behind, they would have had opportunity to return. ¹⁶But as it is, they desire a better country, that is, a heavenly one. Therefore God is not ashamed to be called their God; indeed, he has prepared a city for them.



do you promise to support and pray for these new members in their life in Christ?


We do, and we ask God to help and guide us.





The Virtual Pipe Organ heard in today's worship service is the Organ of the First Lutheran Church of Long Beach, California. Completed in 1976 by the W. Zimmer and Sons Organ Company from Charlotte, NC. This instrument was built around the time when there was reformation of American organ building tonal concepts. The sound of organs had become symphonic in their tonal schemes, but the reformation sought to bring back the brighter and clear tonalities of the Baroque era. This instrument represents some of the tonal concepts of the organ reformation but also retains some character of the Romantic Symphonic qualities. The audio samples are produced by Evensong Music Company, who records and produces organ sample sets of American Organs. The sounds of this pipe organ are played in combination with our Allen Protégé Organ.
