Your voice matters. Paul writes in Romans 12, "For as in one body we have many members, and not all the members have the same function, so we, who are many, are one body in Christ, and individually we are members one of another." How can we be one body if members are missing? How can we thrive if we are incomplete? Or from 1 Corinthians 12: "The eye cannot say to the hand, 'I don't need you.' And the head cannot say to the feet, 'I don't need you.'" We need you—we need you all.

Your voice matters. Especially in song. Why do we sing? Because singing is more powerful than speaking. Because music and text joined together lift us powerfully into God's presence. Because singing has actual physical and neurological benefits. In ways that are marvelous and mysterious, individuals are woven more closely together when they sing together. Singing energizes us. Singing calls us to pour our whole heart into the effort, plus it exercises our body as well. There's a huge difference between 10 or 20 people singing, and 100 or 500. The benefits of singing are vast in any situation, but if you've ever been part of a large group singing together, you have experienced the amazing phenomenon of being transformed as we are woven together in new ways. What if every Sunday was a chance for us to be woven together like this? What if every Sunday left us just a little more hopeful, a little more convinced that God *will* heal this broken world if only we persevere?



Your voice matters. In our life together, on Council, in Bible studies, on our various committees and teams. We have two openings for Council members coming up at the end of this year. If you would like to have your voice matter there, I'll make sure our nominating committee has your name. Which committees and teams, you ask? Come to our Ministry Fair on September 11 and find out. Get involved. Our youth is becoming more active as we move into a new year of learning and service. Which Bible studies? Starting September 21 I'll be offering a "brown bag Bible study" at noon on the first and third Wednesdays (Zoom option available; let me know if you want to zoom in). We'll be looking at the readings for the coming Sunday. That way you will be well-informed to critique my sermon!

The life of Grace Lutheran Church continues to rest on the firm foundation of Christian love and faith shared together, *in person*. As we move into the new school year, let's be bold in coming together to make that foundation even stronger so that we are well equipped to share the good news of Jesus Christ with others. I need you, Grace Lutheran Church needs you, and the world needs you.

The program lasted about 90 minutes starting with the youngest pianist who was around 10 years old and cycled through about 5 other students who all played brilliantly and not only did they play piano, but also sang or played an instrument. I truly marveled at Julian's playing as he played with such skill and was extremely musical. If you are interested in a video recording, please let me know. In the Fall he will attend Temple University and I've asked him if it's alright to stay in touch to see how he is doing. We also had the opportunity to hear Will Shaffer in concert on August 7th. It was fun to put the program together with Will. He said a number of times how much fun it was for him, too. We were unable to make a formal recording, but I believe a few people made small snip-it recordings of some of the music on their phones. While my stepchildren are not too much into music, they did attend and even took home the program that had a Star Wars word search on the back cover, which they completed!

As you may know, I'm a member of the American Guild of Organists. I've been a member since I was a teenager. In a recent letter from the guild, they expressed excitement for the growing interest in church music amongst young people. They offer scholarships and church music internship programs for young organists. This year the guild experienced record-breaking membership in the young organist category. That is wonderful news in my estimation considering the recent COVID restrictions. Each year the guild hosts a National Convention which was in Seattle Washington this year. Featured at that convention was "Hauptwerk" virtual organ software which is exactly what we now have at Grace as part of our new organ. The choir will return as a group on Sunday, September 11th, the morning of the Ministry Fair. We will be back to two services: 8am and 10:30am. I would like to invite new singers to join us this season so please see me or a member of the choir at the Ministry Fair. I will formulate a plan for rehearsals once we see who we have and the best times for everyone. Aside from Sunday morning warmups, the schedule will most likely include every other Wednesday at 1pm with an occasional evening rehearsal that may follow the same schedule as our monthly evening contemplative services.

At the time of writing this letter, my family is getting ready to go on vacation! I'll see you all in September. Stay in tune with upcoming newsletters and Grace Notes for much more as we dive into the Fall.

Community Day of Service September 11

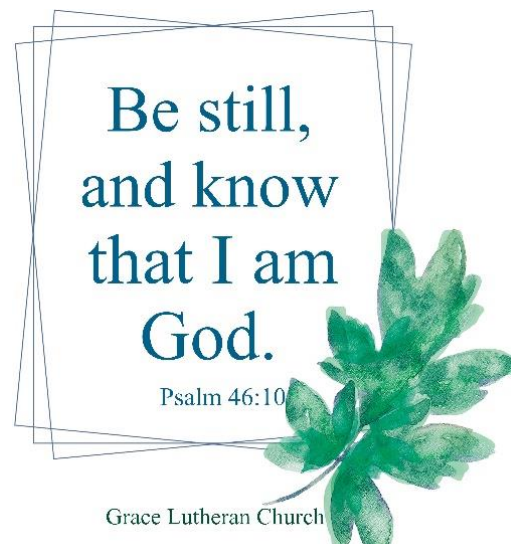

Harvest Home Sunday September 25th

Harvest Home will be celebrated on Sunday, September 25th. Our gifts of food will help those in our immediate communities who need food. These offerings are shared with ***Manna on Main Street*** in Lansdale and ***The Hatfield Food Cupboard*** at our neighbor church, Emmanuel

Evangelical Congregational Church.

You are invited to bring ***canned goods and non-perishable items*** to church during the month of **September**. There will be a display in the narthex with a list of food items needed and a basket where you can place your food offerings. If you would prefer to drop your food at church during the week, a bin will be available outside the Stepping Stones/Main Entrance to Grace. The bin is labeled for **Harvest Home**. (NOTE: Bins will continue to be available each week for the Hatfield Food Cupboard at EEC as the needs are great.)

A few suggested food items from Manna and The Food Cupboard are:

- Pasta (no spaghetti) and Spaghetti Sauce
- Canned tomato products – diced, whole, paste, sauce

"Coats For Kids" Drive:

It's hard to think "WINTER COATS" while we are experiencing so many heatwaves this summer, but it's that time again. H3C will be hosting the Hatfield Community Coat Drive again this year.

During the months of September and October we will be collecting coats for the children of the two local food cupboards and preschools as needed. We need between 160 and 200 coats this year.

Pastor Clay Moyer of Church of the Brethren said there are a

number of new families since last year. So we will need size 12 months and 24 months/ 2T coats for both boys and girls through usual larger sizes for girls and boys especially sizes 12/14 and 16/18. Last year they ran out of coats especially sizes 12/14 and 16/18 most of which were for boys.



The procedure will be to collect the coats at Grace Lutheran until October 23rd, and then they will be moved to Church of the Brethren for the distribution. We will not be giving the coats out at Grace Lutheran.

This year there has been a significant increase in the number of families coming to the food cupboards, so there are more children than ever before. Janet Hague reported in that the EEC food cupboard experienced the highest distribution day of 1400 pounds of food in one day. The needs of our Hatfield families are very real. If you know of anyone who needs a child's coat, please let us know so that a coat can be provided.

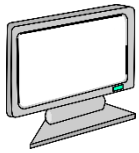
