The animals of God's creation inhabit the skies, the earth, and the sea. They share in the fortunes of human existence and are part of human life. God, who gives us all things, has reminded often in Holy Scripture of animals that served as reminders of God's salvation.

- The paschal lamb in Exodus recalls the delivery of the Israelites from slavery in Egypt
- A giant fish saved Jonah
- Ravens brought bread to Elijah in 1 Kings
- A donkey saw an angel in the book of Numbers

...and animals share in Christ's redemption of all creation. As we give thanks for them, we ask God to richly bless these animals.

#### Let us pray:

Almighty God, you have made us and all living things. For these animals who give us joy, we thank and praise you. For these present, we thank and praise you. Make us faithful caretakers of these animals and all those on earth, as we share in your love for all creation.

We give thanks to you, O God, for animals that live in our homes, on farms, in the wild, and in havens of refuge. Make us ever aware of our responsibility to these, your creatures. Help us to be faithful in caring for them, through the one in whom all creation is made new, Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.** 

Hear our prayers, O God, for our friends, the animals—especially for animals that are suffering; for all that are frightened or lost, or deserted or hungry; and for all those animals that must be put to death. We ask for them your providing care; and for those who deal with them, we ask a heart of compassion, gentle hands, and kind words. Help us to be true friends to animals, that through us they may know the blessing of the merciful; through Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord. **Amen.**
