The Joy of Worship

Holy Week is just around the corner, the most dramatic week of the church year. If you love the church and its worship, you do not want to be left in the dust. Arriving at Easter morning on April 9 without the experience of all that leads up to it, starting on Palm Sunday, April 2, is like frosting with no cake--a sweet encounter but without the substance that gives it meaning.



Most of the year in church we sit passively in our chairs or pews, but during Holy Week we become actors in the story. At Grace this year we are devoting Palm Sunday entirely to a celebration of Jesus' entry into Jerusalem without the Passion narrative that, in modern practice, has come to dominate that day.

Why are we doing this? Because WE are those people hailing the arrival of Jesus into Jerusalem. All we know is the joyful procession and the loud acclamations. We have no idea of what lies ahead. "All glory, laud, and honor!" and "Hosanna, loud hosanna!" we will sing, as Jesus enters riding on a donkey, fulfilling the prophecy of Zechariah.

On Maundy Thursday (from the Latin "mandatum," or "command,"

referring to the commandment Jesus gives that night to love one other as he loves us), we join the disciples around that table in the Upper Room as Jesus assumes the role of the servant that prepares him for the ultimate act of servanthood the next day. Allowing our feet to be washed takes us into Peter's own experience of setting aside his pride and allowing Jesus to wash his feet.

Good Friday, April 7, then brings us the spellbinding passion narrative. We stand at the foot of the cross looking up in disbelief and bitterly lament our participation in Jesus' death. This day is the high point of the entire church year. What God has done in Christ, for our sake, is nowhere more apparent or visceral than in the Crucified God hanging on the cross.

As we hear this narrative and see it in our imagination, we take Jesus' suffering and death into our own bodies. Without this experience of Good Friday we cannot fully receive the transporting joy of Easter. Without death there is no resurrection. Jesus was really, truly dead, and he really, truly rose two days later after the utter stillness of Holy Saturday, fully and bodily alive – just as we too will rise on that great last day when all creation is reconciled in God's love.

Come and worship! Welcome the invitation to become the people of Jerusalem during Holy Week as we move through these climactic days of "the greatest story ever told," and go beyond Easter Sunday to share the good news with all the world in the weeks and months that follow. Alleluia!

From Our Minister of Music:

What are your sources of information? Years ago, I would think everyone received the newspaper. You or a family member may have even been a newspaper delivery person. I grew up around folks who also loved the Funny Pages but never quite related to having a favorite character I might follow. Either way, I think it was a good thing to find a place and time to laugh and enjoy a little humor amidst "the news".

Today we see our news in several ways that are broadcast on tv and all the media formats and apps on our cell phones. News is everywhere and instant! If you think about it, how does it impact our lives? Think deeply... or not! I find all this information "highway" to be so fast paced that sometimes the slow things in my life tend to go unnoticed. There is a revolving moment each day when I think, what am I supposed to do tomorrow? Or in the next several hours? Sometimes I need to refer to my calendar to find all the things I said I would do.

My thought here and how it relates to being your music minister is that you know that music at Grace is growing. We are planting seeds in our music life and it continues to grow. There are things that happen all the time which stem from a song that we sing or an opportunity to share music with someone new. In the chance that you have been moved by music, let me say, that's "good news!"

Pastor Raabe and I were talking about how we notice people at times moving and singing to music! Music has a life and while we each may find different melodies or words to capture our attention and move us, we are part of the rhythm that makes music come to life. I've had many conversations with folks who say they really don't know much about music or sing very well, but that they enjoy our songs or have a favorite song. Hearing those things are music to my ears!

Each week I've been reserving time for our kids to "jump into music". In doing that, we only have a handful of minutes each week to do this, but each child has shown interest and a desire to share things about music and how music fits into their life. Even if a child doesn't have a strong interest to play or sing music, they do have a natural curiosity in how things work to make music or at least want to see if they have music ability. It can be intimidating to "try it out." It's a bit like trying on a new pair of jeans and finding ones that fit just right. Until you find it, you might prefer to just keep wearing your old jeans. Either way, we form our likes and dislikes quite easily it seems. Be it hearing, seeing, doing, or watching others, we find things that we feel fit us well. Music, as you may have heard before, is a universal language. It gives all of us a chance to think about things in a new way or remind us of things that we already know that make the "good news" in our lives more enjoyable.

Be on the watch for a melody and a new rhythm, see if it fits you. As always, I love hearing about your thoughts and interests in music. Keep me informed of your favorites but also the things you like about something new you might hear.

Because I love Grace and seeing all of you each week, my hope is that you find a smile today to share with me the next I see you!

This year WELCA from Grace will be sponsoring the book drive, "BOOKS FOR BABIES," from April 9th to May 12th. We are collecting new and gently used books for all ages of children and especially cardboard books for babies.

Mitzvah Circle Foundation meets critical needs of individuals and families who are struggling with crisis, poverty, homelessness and serious illness in our local neighborhoods. One of projects they support is Baby Diaper Supply Bag that includes diapers, baby wash, wipes and books. Mitzvah Circle Foundation sends a children's hardback cardboard book four times a year to the youngest children. They discovered there is only one book for every 300 homes who are living under the poverty line in America. Giving these books to the children in every Baby Diaper Supply Bag gets books into hands of the most vulnerable children. Help promote literacy for our families in the Hatfield Community. Thank you so much for picking up one or two extra items for our neighbors in need each time you shop. Every offering is helpful!

Below, please find the most recent pantry shortages:

Food: boxed pasta, cold cereal, flour, sugar, canned fruit (no applesauce), 100% fruit juice, chunky soup (all flavors)

Household & Personal Care*: shampoo, conditioner, shaving cream, deodorant, & laundry detergent

Gift Cards: Grocery gift cards are always welcome

*Clients cannot use government assistance (SNAP) funds to purchase these items when they shop at grocery stores.

Your non-perishable donations can be placed in our narthex bins, OR, if necessary, in the outside food cupboard plastic bins located by the doors leading into Stepping Stones (preferably on Sunday mornings when it can be brought inside).

Please be aware...if food is left outside in the elements, it might not be picked up for a few days.


Calling All Yoga Lovers!
