the past; even the light from Sirius, the brightest star, takes 9 years to reach us).

How, then, can we not thank God for this with every breath we take? Scripture tells us that the entire breadth of creation shares equally with human beings in actively praising God. "Let the sea roar, and all that fills it," we sing in Psalm 96, "let the field exult, and everything in it." In Psalm 98, "Let the rivers clap their hands; let the hills sing together with joy." In Isaiah 55 the trees clap their hands and the mountains and hills "burst into song." And in Isaiah 35, "the desert shall rejoice and blossom; like the crocus it shall blossom abundantly and rejoice with joy and singing." What a symphony is going on all around us!

So it is with the church. The Holy Spirit, given to us at that first Pentecost, gave birth to the church as our primary means of thanks and praise to God. It is here that our faith is deepened, and our thanksgiving made bolder by voices joined together in confession, song and prayer. It is here that God's Word is received and preached. It is here that we discover the Gospel's connection with our daily lives. As Paul tells us in Romans 10:17, "Faith comes from hearing, and hearing through the word of Christ."

And it is here that we come to dwell in Christ and he in us. "Abide in me as I abide in you," Jesus urges us in John 15. So, I am pleading with you: Come to church. Come back to church! We have a place just for you.

God's indwelling is best experienced in fellowship. Together, we come to know Jesus, dig deep into the truth of God's Word, and find that new meanings are opened in our midst.

This summer I want to encourage you not only to return to church, but to gather in one or more of these groups for prayer, study, and conversation:

- Book study, Praying God's Word: Breaking Free from Spiritual Strongholds by Beth Moore. What is a stronghold? From 2 Corinthians 10:3-5, it is "every proud obstacle that keeps people from knowing God" anything that keeps us from living fully and freely, anything that compels us to believe it is bigger and better than God, anything that consumes our energy and keeps us from the abundant life that Christ offers. We will meet in the Wagner House on the last Sundays at 7 p.m. on June 25, July 30, and August 27, with light refreshments. Books will be available for \$7 in the office or on Sundays at church starting June 18, or for no charge if the cost is an obstacle. We'll be looking only at selected chapters this summer but can add more if the group wants to continue into the fall.
- Compline and Contemplative Prayer: Lectio Divina, Examen, the Jesus Prayer. Let's gather by candlelight around the font on fourth Thursdays, at 8 p.m., June 22, July 27, and August 24 to let the beautiful night service of Compline lead us into one of these time-honored prayer practices.
- **Coffee Hour each Sunday.** You are always invited to gather on the veranda (in good weather) or inside Fellowship Hall for food and conversation, a great way to catch up with old friends and meet new ones.

For the two groups, please see the signup sheets on the Community bulletin board in the narthex, or simply let me know if you're interested.

EEC Food Cupboard

These donations are extremely helpful in feeding the MANY people that continue to show up each month for resources at the food cupboard. Thank you to Pastor Raabe, along with Grace youth and parents, for moving donations from the Post Office (where postal workers kindly delivered all the donations they picked up from residents) to the EEC. Many thanks to all of you who continue to share your blessings with our Hatfield neighbors! Below, please find the most recent pantry shortages:

Food: any type of boxed pasta (including lasagna), spaghetti sauce, rolled oats, canned fruit, canned WHOLE potatoes, canned soup (except chicken noodle), rolled oats, 100% fruit juice

Household & Personal Care*: laundry detergent, paper towels, men's & women's razors & shave cream **Gift Cards:** Grocery gift cards are always welcome

*Clients cannot use government assistance (SNAP) funds to purchase these items when they shop at grocery stores.

Your non-perishable donations can be placed in our narthex bins, OR, if necessary, in the outside food cupboard plastic bins located by the doors leading into Stepping Stones (preferably on Sunday mornings when it can be brought inside).

Please be aware...if food is left outside in the elements, it might not be picked up for a few days.


COFFEE HOUR: A Grace Tradition
