Learning to Listen

I once attended a chamber music concert with a theologian friend who is also a musician. I found it delightful, and ultimately a little distracting, that she responded with a "Hmmmm!" or "Ooooh!" to almost everything that happened – all those little things that make music worth



listening to, including the subtle bending of tempo, nuanced dynamic shadings, and the use of articulation to make a note especially expressive. The concert was good, so there were a lot of these!

What I quickly realized was that she really knew how to listen. The music was not just washing over her as it seemed to be for many others in the audience. Instead, she practiced an art of fine listening that allowed her to be inside the mystery, making the music happen right alongside the performers.

This memory came to mind when I was thinking about how we learn to listen to God's voice. At that moment Jack Noble White's wonderful musical setting of Psalm 95:1-7 popped into my head:

Come let us sing to the Lord; let us shout for joy to the Rock of our salvation.

Let us come before his presence with thanksgiving and raise a loud shout to him with psalms.

For the Lord is a great God, and a great King above all gods.

In his hand are the caverns of the earth, and the heights of the hills are his also.

The sea is his, for he made it, and his hands have molded the dry land.

Come, let us bow down, and bend the knee, and kneel before the Lord our Maker.

For he is our God, and we are the people of his pasture and the sheep of his hand. Oh, that today you would hearken to his voice! (Version from The Hymnal 1982)

What do you notice in the progression of these verses? That first, we are shouting; but by verse 7, we are listening, because in verse 6 we quieted down and assumed a posture of worship.

Worship returns to our fall/winter schedule of 8 and 10:30 am on September 10th How do we learn to hear God's voice, especially over all the noise of daily life?

God's voice has been with us from the beginning. Genesis opens with the words "In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth." But what was the mode of that creation? Did God stretch out God's hands and start shaping the universe like a potter with a primeval lump of dark matter? I think not. Everything suggests that the acts of creating was sound: *God spoke*. God spoke creation into being.

It's true that the Hebrew word in Genesis 1:1 is "created." But Genesis immediately goes on to show that God's most characteristic action is *to speak*. Check it out: God speaks in Genesis 1:3, 5, 6, 8, 9, 10, 11, 14, 20, 22, 24, 26, 28, and 29. God's voice calls all the forms of creation into being.

God's way with creation, then, is the way of language. And God continues to speak. Are we listening?

Listening for God's voice is not as challenging as it might seem. God is prodding us all the time. Think of a time when you were trying to decide about something important and friends told you, "Follow your gut" or "Trust your instinct." What do these phrases mean? Our gut itself has nothing to tell us (other than "don't eat that kind of food again!"). And humans have no instincts where complex life choices are involved. What those friends were really saying was: "Listen for that still, small voice of God, and bind yourself to it."

To listen we must clear away all the distractions so that only the voice of God remains. Sit quietly, open your mind and heart to the winds of the Holy Spirit, and let God's voice come to you on those breezes.

"Everything in life is vibration," Albert Einstein is supposed to have said. The entire universe exists as a series of vibrations set in motion by God's initial spoken command. Everything in creation is bound together by the gracious movement of God toward creation, manifested in our world as the gift of Jesus Christ. If God's voice is still sounding, especially through his beloved Son, why would it not be sounding for you – and through you?


Oh, that today you would hearken to his voice!

2023 CROP WALK




Sunday, October 8th Join and help change the world!

The North Penn/Lansdale 45th Annual **CROP Walk** will be held rain or shine. The walk begins and ends at Manna on Main Street in Lansdale. Won't you join in the fun and walk so that others may have food on their tables!! The funds raised at area CROP Walks are given to Church World Service. CWS distributes these funds to the areas in the world in most need of help. Our local walk returns 25 percent of the funds raised to Manna on Main Street. In 2022, Manna served 66,176 meals. Manna also distributed 662,799 pounds of food to 1,178 households (includes 3,328 individuals).

Manna is organizing the North Penn/Lansdale CROP Walk. The walk will begin at Manna on Main Street, 606 East Main Street, Lansdale. People will gather in the lobby of North Penn commons outside Manna on Main Street. Walkers will travel down Main Street in Landale past Saint John's United Church of Christ, where Manna was founded, and continue to North Cannon Avenue. This year's 2.6-mile route will tie-in Manna's past, present and future.

Do you know CROP Hunger Walks are community-based walk fundraising events held in cities and towns across the United States, created to support the global mission of <u>Church World Service</u>, a faithbased organization transforming communities around the globe through just and sustainable responses to hunger, poverty, displacement and disaster. After a CROP Hunger Walk ends, 25% of the funds raised will be returned to the host community to support local hunger fighting efforts.

Do you know that the Crop Project began in **1947** when farmers were asked to donate food and seed crops to our hungry neighbors in post-World War II Europe and Asia. The first CROP Hunger Walks took place in Bismarck, North Dakota (1969), and **York, Pennsylvania** (1970). Since then, CROP Hunger Walk events have been held in hundreds of communities, large and small, raising millions of dollars to eradicate hunger and poverty.


