## FALL “PLEDGE PARTY”: An Invitation

Your Giving to God team -- Ken Seiler, Jaime Snyder and Wendy Walter, with Pastor Raabe – is delighted to invite you to our fall “pledge party” for the month of October on the theme **“HERE I AM, LORD: WHAT CAN I GIVE?”**



Balloons? Cake? Well, this is not a party in the traditional sense of the word, but a four-week *adventure* into the gifts, talents and expressions of faith we find at Grace across generations.

We’ll focus on youth on October 1, young adults on October 8, those of middle age on October 15 and our retirees on October 22. Each week we’ll enjoy what each group bring to our life together and give thanks for the many gifts of God’s grace. On October 29 we will bless the pledge cards that you should have received by now. If you forget to bring yours there are plenty more in the narthex. You may mail them back to us or put them in the designated box. Please have these back to us by October 22.

Also, we prayerfully ask that you consider an increase in your pledge this year. Ask yourself, “What can I give?” The cost of living is increasing but so are costs facing Grace. However, we don’t ask for this simply to pay our bills. The fact is that even a slight increase in giving among all members will make a world of difference in our ability to develop initiatives and ministries to take us into a bright future. For example, just \$5 more per week from each active member could raise enough for a new part-time youth ministry position! Let’s be full-hearted in our desire to bring new life to our mission statement: “To glorify God, to grow in faith, to give in service, together in Christ.”

Here are some features of “pledge party” you can look forward to:

- The hymn “Here I Am, Lord” will be featured as the Gathering Hymn each week, with successive stanzas featuring the designated age group in some way.
- Our team has composed beautiful devotionals for each week focusing on each age. These will be inserted into your bulletin, attached with the weekly Grace Notes email, and displayed on posterboard outside the sanctuary entrances.
- Be looking for new banners on the veranda in bright fall colors, centered on the theme of welcoming.
- On October 22 we will share a meal after the 10:30 service prepared by our youth and served by our retirees. And yes, here there will be cake and balloons!

**Postscript: A few thoughts on giving**

When we commit time, talent, money, and other resources to church or to the world, we also symbolize something that goes beyond the actual immediate action. We represent the commitment of our whole lives to the values and practices of God. We say, through our gifts, "We are in covenant with God to work towards a world in which God's gracious love shapes our perception of all things, and in which God's gracious love creates gracious and loving relationships among all people and desires such relationships among all living things and all other elements of nature." In other words, we are active members of God's kingdom.

This dimension is especially in play when we place money or a check in the offering plate, or when we mail a check or make an electronic transfer of funds. The act of making an offering is one of renewing commitment to God and to God's ways of love and justice. Each week we say, "Count me in the movement from this fractured and fractious world to a world of love, justice, peace, freedom, dignity, security, and abundance for all."

Moreover, the practice of giving to the church can be a means of grace. One reason we worship weekly is that we so easily forget the presence and love of God, and can so easily drift into attitudes, values, and behaviors that work against God's purposes of love for all. Worship reminds us of the promises of God to us and of our response to God. This is one reason my prayer is that you will worship with us *every* week, not just once in a while. Helping with service project or attending a meeting at church also reminds us of the brokenness of the world, God's healing love, and our commitment to be part of the movement towards a loving and just world.

Look for a few words on this topic at the time of "Offering" during our worship services this month.

It's the 3rd week of September and I'm preparing a lot of new music. Here's a few things to be thinking of and thankful for. Our dearest friend, Dale Moyer, as most of you know, was a devoted choir singer for years. Dale knew a lot about choir and the music they sing each week. 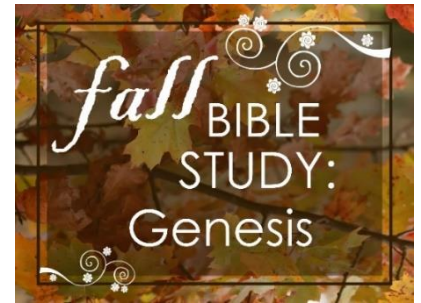

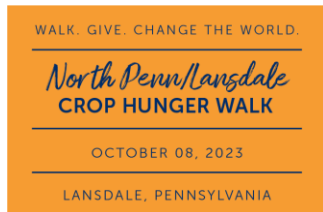
## Harvest Home THANK YOU!!
