#### FROM THE PASTOR: Free Will, or Faith?

attributing stuff to us that isn't there."

Awake, my soul! Awake, harp and lyre! I will awaken the dawn. (Psalm 57:8-9)



We all have a routine for beginning our day. Perhaps quiet reflection, journaling, prayer, a bit of reading. Then for me it is making my daily to-do list. I use index cards to remember everything I want to get done that day and carry it around with me. Sometimes I get through the list; sometimes tasks get carried over to

the next day or the next. But each morning I choose what my daily tasks will be. Or...do I?

A new book by neurobiologist Robert Sapolsky of Stanford University says: No, you don't. In Determined: A Science of Life Without Free Will, he argues that there is no free will. We do not freely make choices. Other factors bred into us determine everything that we do.

I suppose there could be something to this. For an unknown reason, I'm someone who needs to have things well ordered. When I leave the

office at the end of the day my desk must be cleared off and everything put in its place. I'm one of those people who must have the stapler lined up perfectly with the paper clip holder and my pen poised for the next

day's action. I don't run with wild impulses (although that could be more fun). After decades of studying humans and primates, Sapolsky decided that all human behavior is beyond our conscious control. Instead, he claims that neurochemical influences govern everything we do. We may think we are choosing to do something, he says, but we are not. Every decision, every action is a result of brain functioning that has been conditioned by genetics, environment, and other factors. His conclusion is that free will is a myth. He claims that "The world is really screwed up and made much, much more unfair by the fact

People who know a lot about neurobiology might go along with some of this. Yes, our upbringing and environment shape how we see the world and react to it. But...everything? We actually do not choose our life partners? Our vocations? Our vacations? That what we do when worship is over, either go left to exit, or turn right and come to the coffee hour (by the way, please choose this...if you can) is preordained? That biological and neurological factors beyond our awareness determine every choice we make?

that we reward people and punish people for things they have no control over. We've got no free will. Stop

Where the well-being of humankind is concerned, losing the conviction of free will and moral responsibility could be cataclysmic. At the very least it would promote cheating on tests, becoming careless in one's work, and giving free rein to aggressive impulses – the only guiding principle being, "So what?" In religious life this is the equivalent of placing all your eggs in the basket of what Dietrich Bonhoeffer called "cheap grace." If I'm forgiven no matter what, then what does it matter what I do? Taking it to an extreme, one could say then what's the point of doing anything? Or of living at all? You can see what a dangerous road this would take us down. Because in the very fiber of our being we know that doing nothing is the worst option: All it takes for evil to triumph is that good people do nothing.

What if we were to reframe the entire question? Instead of seeing human life as a matter of choices or the lack of them, what if we considered over lives to be wrapped in the mantle of faith? That everything we do is an expression of the faith that grows in our hearts because we believe in Jesus Christ?

We already know that "if you confess with your lips that Jesus is Lord, and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, then you will be saved" (Romans 10:9). Doesn't *this* govern our approach to every human interaction and every situation that we encounter? Whose choice is it, then, about what to do in a given situation? Not yours, but God's. How can you take that stack of hundred-dollar bills that you found in the street (which we heard about in church on Oct. 22) and stuff them in your pocket, believing them to be yours? You can't. Someone lost them, and God always finds what is lost. God is just using you to help return them. In every situation, God is using you to do the work of the kingdom.

Our seniors, who we celebrated on the culminating week of our October pledge drive, can help us with this. When by the grace of God we reach what we call senior age, I think we naturally develop a reflective approach to life steeped in gratitude. We have been given 70 years, or perhaps 80, to quote the psalmist. From there we can look back and grasp how our lives unfolded in a way that we now see was perfectly in accordance with God's will, even though at times we may have felt those choices were random or even confused.

If we can learn from our seniors to focus the lens of faith on our lives, we will see that God is guiding our every step. Our will and God's will are one. My own life is one of twists and turns that appeared to be incomprehensible until I learned to view them through this lens of faith. All those detours in fact led to where I am at this moment, talking with you. What's interesting is that most of those twists and turns were not conscious choices. Things just happened, and I went along. But now I can see that God was leading me the entire time even through what I long believed to be missteps. They weren't.

So should we give up on free will, let go of the idea you are in control of everything you do? No. Instead, accept that the life God has given you, with its twists and turns, joys and sorrows, rejoicing and suffering, is unfolding fully within God's sight. And trust that in every circumstance God makes possible a response of faith. For it is those responses of faith that the risen Christ gives us, again and again and again, the promise of new life now and eternal life always.

May your Thanksgiving be blessed with the knowledge of God's perfect love in his Son, given for you.


the INreach team and we would be happy to facilitate a pickup. We can also take soup that has recently been frozen. Recipes and containers will be available in the narthex starting in October.
