

FROM THE PASTOR:

Lent: Our Joyful Discipline

"Discipline" is a word whose Biblical meaning has been lost on our culture. It's generally heard in terms of punishment to correct



Lent is the 40-day journey (not including Sundays) that begins with Ash Wednesday, which falls this year on February 14. The word comes from the old English word "lencten," meaning lengthen. It refers the lengthening of days as spring approaches. Just as the earth is being renewed, so this is a time for us to reflect on the new birth we received in our baptism and prepare ourselves spiritually to walk with Jesus into his passion, death, and resurrection.

This season offers us a opportunity to take on disciplines that open new pathways in our soul to God. In so doing we are invited to let go of anxieties and become like children, with God as our "Abba" ("Daddy"), a word that both Jesus and Paul used to address God. Psalm 131 helps bring us there:

O Lord, I am not proud; I have no haughty looks, I do not occupy myself with great matters, or with things that are too hard for me.

But I still my soul and make it quiet, Like a child upon its mother's breast; My soul is quieted within me.

O Israel, wait upon the Lord,

From this time forth and forevermore. (ELW translation)



For Lutherans, Lent is not about giving up. It is about taking on, from the renewed perspective of repentance. As we heard recently in worship, repentance is not an act of contrition. Rather it involves a complete reorientation of body, mind and soul – a turning away from patterns and practices that separate us from God, and a turning toward the living Christ. This new orientation governs how we act and react, what our priorities are, how we treat our neighbors, where we invest time and energy, what we do with our available resources.

Because Jesus is calling us to follow him, his orientation becomes ours. We turn away from the comfort of privilege and turn toward to the poor and those on the margins of society. We turn away from the need to justify ourselves and toward the need to seek justice for others.

There are many joyful disciplines you could undertake this Lent. Help with our Thursday Suppers. Spend time each day with a Lenten devotional; pick up a copy in the narthex.

Commit to reading through an entire book of the Bible, little by little, day by day, possibly using one of these methods:

Practice #1: PRAY the Scripture.

It is said that Martin Luther taught his barber a simple way to pray the scripture. It is a four-step approach signified by the letters **P-R-A-Y**. **Praise**. **Repent**. **Ask**. **Yield**.

Practice #2: Lectio Divina: Divine Reading of Scripture.

There are a number of approaches. This works well at home with family members or in a small group with others. What in the passage catches my attention? What does it touch my life? What does God want me to do?

Practice #3: Reading with All Your Senses: The Ignatian Method. Named for Ignatius of Loyola, a contemporary of Martin Luther, this encourages us to read a passage with all our senses, to put ourself in the midst of the story, to be an active participant, and then to ask—What would Jesus say to me?

As you embark on your journey of reorientation, you'll notice differences in our worship. Alleluias and hymns of praise are set aside. Our songs to become more reflective. The liturgical color changes to the purple, which signifies repentance or penitence. Everything turns inward until the victorious day of Resurrection when the colors brighten and Alleluias once again break out in joyful celebration. Let's walk through these 40 days together.

The churches of the Indian Valley Cluster will host a "Fat Tuesday" celebration on **Tuesday February 13** at Advent Lutheran in Harleysville, 470 Landis Road. We will start with the burning of palms at 5:30 p.m. and move into the pancake supper at 6 p.m. prepared by the pastors, followed by a program of jokes and hilarity.

We are hoping to get table of 6-8 Grace folks together. **If you want to attend, please let Pastor Raabe know by February 4!** Each person will be given a silly joke or riddle, a piece of trivia, or some other kind of information to share with the others you are sitting with. We are hoping to all be entertained and informed by sharing with one another.

In some traditions, the day before Ash Wednesday is a day before the fasting and gravity of the Lenten season begins — a time for using up all the fat and sugar in the household, and for celebrating the silliness and frivolity that will be set aside as we journey to the cross. Other names for the day are Mardi Gras (French for Fat Tuesday), Shrove Tuesday (Absolution Tuesday), Fastnacht Day (German for Fast Night or fasting eve), Carnival (Latin for Farewell to Meat), or Pancake Tuesday.

Participating churches in addition to Grace are Advent and Christ in Harleysville, Emmanuel in Souderton, and Little Zion and St. Paul's in Telford.

A message from Janet Hague: First, a thank you to everyone who contributed to the "Angel Boxes" at Christmas, allowing us to replenish supplies of personal hygiene products and paper products to keep our shelves stocked for the 84 families who visited our food cupboard in December.
