FROM THE PASTOR: In the Name of Jesus

The church festival that commemorates the circumcision and naming of Jesus always falls on January 1. What better way to start the new year than by asking: Why DO we always pray in Jesus' name? Our prayers typically end,



"....in Jesus' name we pray." Or, "we ask this in the name of Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord."

Why is that necessary? Isn't a simple "Amen" enough? Doesn't God hear all our prayers regardless of how we conclude them?

Actually it is critical in Christian prayer to provide the context of Jesus' name for our petitions. Danish theologian Søren Kierkegaard, who fiercely believed that Christianity was not a philosophy or doctrine but a way of life, explained it this way:

A magistrate orders this or commands that in the name of the King. It naturally follows that what he commands must be the King's will—he cannot command his own will in the King's name. That same is true of praying in the name of Jesus, to pray in such a way that is in conformity with the will of Jesus. I cannot pray in the name of Jesus to have my own will.

"The name of Jesus is decisive: it means to pray in such a way that I dare name Jesus in it, to think of him and his holy will together with whatever I am praying for. Finally, when a magistrate gives an order in the name of the King it means the King assumes responsibility. So too with prayer in the name of Jesus; Jesus assumes the responsibility and all the consequences. He steps forward for us, steps into the place of the person praying.¹

As we greet the New Year we have been conditioned to point ahead to resolutions, new habits, and healthier habits. Less sugar. More exercise. Out with the old and in with the new.

But in our prayer life we always return to what God has done to point the way forward. The name "Jesus" means "the Lord saves." In this baby lies the salvation of the world. To each of us this means salvation from thoughtless, careless practices we had allowed to overwhelm our lives. Jesus Christ is the Alpha and the

Omega. In him we are bringing our past into the present to point us toward the future – a future in which life, not death, has the last word.

When we pray in Jesus' name, we bring this conviction into each petition. We pray in the confidence that he attends our every need, leads us where we need to go, and will never leave us. Praying in Jesus' name ensures that our prayers will be one aligned with God's will *for us* in the gift of his Son *for us*, now and forever.

And now, we may say: Amen!

NEW TO GRACE: Thursday Soup Supper, starting in Lent

Starting on the first Thursday in Lent, February 15, our intention is to serve a healthy meal every Thursday night at Grace to people who are hungry, and if they are open to it, enjoy their fellowship. All food will be prepared fresh. Leftovers will be packaged for our guests to take with them. Proposed menu: Green salad, mustard vinaigrette, or ranch dressing

House vegetable puree soup, weekly special soup Bread, rolls Honey cake Fresh fruit



Costs: Startup expenditure will be under \$600. Ongoing expenses will be approximately \$30/week. Pots, pans, knives, cutting boards, serving utensils, sterno, and small wares will be purchased from Remo Supply in Norristown at a discount. Whenever possible, used equipment will be obtained. Seasonal vegetables will be purchased from Produce Junction in Hatfield or donated to us by Janet Hague at the Hatfield Food Cupboard from their surplus.

Bread will be donated by a local commercial bakery. Honey cake will be baked weekly to a standardized recipe by volunteers.

Fresh fruit will be donated by Janet Hague and Carol Bauer from the Garden of Health.

Startup and ongoing expenses will be obtained by community donations and other funding sources.

Staffing:

It is assumed that volume at the beginning will be low. Four congregation or community members will be needed for setup, service, dishwashing, cleanup and breakdown. As popularity grows, more will be needed. Past experience shows that the people who attend this type of supper often become key volunteers. A core group of efficient workers develops so that the burden is shared.

Shopping, transportation of goods, and overall coordination will be managed by Pastor Raabe and Lou Farrell. Talk to either of them if you want to get involved!

EEC Food Cupboard

A message from Janet Hague: Thanks to everyone at Grace who supports our food cupboard at Emmanuel. Just this past Tuesday evening, 12/5/23, we distributed almost 2,300 lbs. of items to 27 families plus another 3 families who shopped on Monday. We project that by the end of 2023, we will have given over 32 tons of non-perishable food, produce, baked goods, and essential personal care products to about 180 different Hatfield families who visited at least once during the year. Faithful donors--and volunteers--from Grace are vital to our ministry. Thanks to all of you!

MAKE OUR GLUTEN-FREE COMMUNION BREAD

Try your hand at our recipe. The key is to beat the batter well, and to spread the rounds with a flat knife.

Ingredients:

4 large eggs
1/2 cups water
1 tablespoon +1 tsp Honey
1 tablespoon +1 tsp molasses
2 tablespoons olive oil
1 & 1/2 cups Pamela's Bread Mix, firmly packed
1/2 tsp salt
1/2 tsp baking soda



Directions:

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Beat eggs until light & fluffy. Add water, honey, molasses & olive oil. Add dry *ingredients* and beat well until the batter has thickened.

Line 2 baking sheets with parchment paper. Using an ice cream scoop, put 4 rounds on each baking sheet. With the flat side of a knife gently smooth out into rounds, 5-6 inches in diameter.

Bake 12-15 minutes, Cool on wire rack. Wrap in plastic wrap or baggies. Freeze until ready to use.

Each bag of Pamela's GF bread mix, with this recipe, yields 16 rounds; each round serves approximately 15-20. I have been told that this recipe can be made with a standard GF flour mix but I have not tried it. The Pamela's mix adds extra flavor. – Nancy Raabe
