FROM THE PASTOR: WORSHIP MATTERS

When I was promoting our Communion Instruction Event (April 20) a few weeks ago, I mentioned that perhaps some of you might want answers to questions such as: Why can't we use beer and pretzels for communion? Why do we



discourage the practice of virtual communion via livestream?

In response, a few of you mentioned that you *would* be interested in hearing those answers. That made me think that perhaps there are many other worship-related things you have been wondering about: Why do we do what we do, and how and when we do it?

With some helpful resources from our Churchwide office (elca.org), I came up with the idea for a summer forum **on the fourth Sunday of every month** from 10:15-11 a.m., following our 9:15 summer service. We'll be in the fellowship hall, but you may enjoy coffee and treats without participating in the discussion. (A few tables will be set up on the veranda if you prefer to go outdoors.) The tone will be casual – I want to hear what YOU have to say. We may not get to all these topics on each fourth Sunday, but we'll try. Bring all your questions!



Laurel House is a Montgomery County organization that works to end domestic violence and provides housing and education for the victims of domestic violence. An order form is included in this newsletter. Please put your order in an envelope marked Mother's Day Carnations. Place it in the offering plate or the basket in the narthex. Orders may also be mailed to the church office or placed in the mailbox outside the main entrance to Grace.

A Word from the Giving to God Team and the Offering Counters

Thank you very much for your generous giving to Grace Lutheran Church and its ministries this year. For those of you using envelopes for giving, you've noticed the change from two envelopes to one envelope system. There are a few things you can do to make it easier for the Offering Counters as they complete this task each Monday:

- 1. Please don't use Scotch tape unless you need to. The envelopes are designed to open easily. There's no need to tape them unless you're enclosing a large amount of loose change. Last year's envelopes had poor glue, and frequently did not stick, however, this year we have made sure that we have returned to the quality envelopes.
- 2. Please mark the outside of the white envelope with the amount you're enclosing, and mark clearly the dollar amount you intend for each of the three categories. Don't use checkmarks or percentages. The counters have been known to miscount. Writing the amount on the envelope helps us avoid mistakes.
- 3. If you leave a white envelope blank, the entire amount will be counted towards the General Fund. If that's what you intended, that's fine. But if you want it to go to the designated funds, please use the breakdown. We don't want to guess.
- 4. It's OK to write one check for several envelopes. Just be sure to write amounts on every envelope and attach them all together. Paper clips work well. Use staples only if you must.
- 5. If you have envelopes, please use them if possible. This simplifies the tracking and crediting of your generous donations. If you don't have access to your envelopes, or just want to use a plain envelope, please write your envelope number on the envelope if you recall it, but at a minimum, include your full name. If you don't have envelopes, you can call the office and request them.
- 6. You are welcome to use electronic giving if you prefer, and we appreciate those that use this method of giving. It also simplifies the counting process. You can contact the office, look at our website, or see the information in Grace Notes about this method of giving.

We gratefully accept gifts in all forms. Our procedures are based on the envelope system so that the gifts can be credited to you for tracking and year end giving statements. We'll continue to accept gifts with notes on odd bits of paper, but it all goes faster and with fewer errors if you use your envelopes, reference your envelope numbers, or use electronic giving. Your non-perishable donations can be placed in our narthex bins by the conference room.


