FROM THE PASTOR: Prayers in Action

As people of the gospel, we sing for many reasons. One is to be woven more closely together in faith, hope and love as we lift our voices to God and come out of our individual shells to mysteriously



become part of one body. Another is to be inspired by the words that we are singing; all our hymns and songs are carefully chosen with their texts in mind.

In our Vacation Bible school last month, we started every evening with dinner and then shared four songs together drawn from our worship tradition. You heard them if you were with us in church on July 28.

I really liked the song we opened with: "All around the world, kids are praying." It had an especially thoughtful phrase: "Worship God each day and put your prayers in action."

That made me think more deeply about the nature of worship. We have our weekly worship service and other special services, regular times in which we thank and praise God and ask God to strengthen our faith through familiar hymns and structures. But as the song suggests, worship IS action -- action that tells others about who God is. That our God is the one who created us out of overflowing love, the one who redeemed us through the grace-filled gift of his Son, the one whose Spirit through our baptism gives us new life and is always surprising us with invitations to make God's love visible.

How does God's love become visible in the world? Through you, and all the things you do to express that. We could even say that any tangible expression of God's love is a form of worship.

As I thought about this, I remembered the example of a friend at a church that had been struggling for a couple of years with an ineffective interim pastor. The people of the church were growing frustrated and even angry. Then the pastor became very ill and was forced to abruptly resign. His days are now numbered. Even though my friend had had a difficult time with him, she resolved to visit him in the hospital.

The visit was unsettling; he didn't seem to know who she was and didn't show any expression of gratitude for the visit. Yet she was glad she went. She might not have thought of it this way, but her act of visiting him was a form of worship. She didn't just sit home and pray; she put her prayers in action through her visit, hard as it was for her.

We people of Grace are good at prayer. We know how to talk to God and we know that God hears everything we lift in prayer. We know that, in doing so, our relationship is deepened with Jesus, who asks us to cast all our burdens on him. As we move toward our fall season, I invite you to find new ways to put your prayers in action. The Giving to God team has a theme for the 2024-25 year called "Grace in Action." You'll be hearing more about that soon. Let's embrace that call to put our prayers in action, to place our trust in God's gracious guidance. Let's see what the year has in store for us!

A few of you have wanted to know why we are revisiting the idea of moving into the fall with one combined worship service. If you were with us on Memorial Day weekend, you heard comments about how energizing it was to be one worshiping body again. With this in mind, Pastor Raabe suggested we revisit the possibility of combining our two services into one throughout the year. As we learned when we considered this two years ago, most congregations in our area of our size moved to one service during the pandemic and have remained on that schedule.

Why are we returning to this question? Because many of us enjoy being together as one body instead of being divided between services -- to see the joy of being together, just look at the banner photo on our Facebook page; because it is more encouraging and uplifting to have a greater number of people in worship; because then everyone will get to experience elements that we've had only at the 10:30 service, such as choir music or special activities involving youth and children; and because having only one service makes it easier to recruit worship assistants and altar guild helpers.

At the same time, we recognize that some of you cherish the pattern your Sunday mornings have had, centering on either an early or late service, and that you are reluctant to change that.


From **September 20-26** Pastor Raabe will be taking a third week of vacation to travel to France (the Toulouse area) to visit her sister.

You are invited to bring *canned goods and non-perishable items* to church during the months of **August and September.** There will be a display in the narthex with a list of food items needed and a basket where you can place your food offerings. Also, the Hatfield Food Cupboard would appreciate gift cards (Giant, Aldi, ShopRite, etc.) or cash/checks for donations. Checks should be made out to Grace Lutheran/memo: Hatfield Food Cupboard. The Food Cupboard can purchase special items needed for their families including discounts on meat items.
