From the Pastor: New Beginnings

How do we look ahead to the new year? What is our frame of mind?

Dietrich Bonhoeffer gives us a stirring example in his last theological work, "By Gracious Powers So Wonderfully Sheltered." Bonhoeffer wrote this poem in Berlin's Tegel Prison, where he spent the entire year of 1944 imprisoned for his participation in a plot to kill Adolf Hitler; he was ultimately executed in the concentration camp at Flossenbürg in April 1945, just days before Americans liberated the camp.

The text resides in our hymnal, *Evangelical Lutheran Worship*, as #626 but is rarely sung because it has not yet found a good tune, despite several attempts by notable composers.

"By Gracious Powers" is an important text for the life of faith because it shows us how to give thanks for what we have received, and to look forward to what we are promised, by acknowledging the hardships as well as the joys. The last three stanzas read:

- 3 And when this cup you give is filled to brimming with bitter suff'ring, hard to understand, we take it thankfully and without trembling out of so good and so beloved a hand.
- 4 Yet when again in this same world you give us the joy we had, the brightness of your sun, we shall remember all the days we lived through and our whole life shall then be yours alone.
- 5 By gracious pow'rs so faithfully protected, so quietly, so wonderfully near, we live each day in hope, with you beside us, and go with you through ev'ry coming year.

At Grace, some aspects of the old year have not been easy. We lost to the sleep of death several beloved longtime beloved members of our family as we prayed them into God's care. We lost our former minister of music Kevin Freaney upon his resignation. We moved to weekly communion, which was an undertaking for our hard-working Altar Guild and Music and Worship Committee, because more people are needed to make that happen and worship helpers are typically in short supply. We completed the long-discussed project to

mount flatscreens in the sanctuary, which requires the repositioning of banners that have long adorned our worship space.

Yet there are signs of the hope in which we live each day, with God beside us.

New members are contributing significantly to our lives in surprising and very generous ways. Our Thursday Soup Suppers have taken on a life of their own. Our new Director of Youth Ministry, Annette Dittman, has found a place in the heart of every child who attends worship with her lively children's messages and Sunday School lessons during both services, and she is pulling our youth together as well. More worship helpers have stepped up, including some who had never done these jobs before. We will have a youth member on Council for the first time in several years. We have a new ministry team, the Fellowship Committee, which is busy planning things we can do together -- not only to have fun but to raise money. And we have completed the search for a new Minister of Music by hiring Susanna Faust, who begins on January 5.

Members of the current Psalms of Lament class are coming to understand that you cannot have authentic praise without lament. We must name our sufferings before we can genuinely thank God for all God has done. Dietrich Bonhoeffer's hymn recognizes sorrows of life and the reign of death in a world that is still under the power of sin and the devil. Yet shining through this text is the hope in the God of grace who promises to make all things work together for the ultimate good of God's children.

Let us enter the new year in that frame of mind, ready to share the good news with everyone we meet.

Announcement of our new MINISTER OF MUSIC

The Grace Council and the musician search committee are pleased to announce that Grace has hired Susanna Faust as our new Minister of Music, effective January 1. Many of you will remember her from the services she played at Grace on October 13.

A native of York, Pennsylvania, Susanna studied organ music at Lenoir-Rhyne University in Hickory, NC, which is affiliated with the North Carolina Synod of the ELCA. She received her Master's degree from the prestigious College-Conservatory of Music at the University of Cincinnati, and has served Lutheran, Episcopal, and Greek Orthodox congregations in the Philadelphia area.

In addition to her proficiency on the organ, Susanna is in demand as a private piano teacher and maintains a studio of a dozen students each week. She has wide-ranging musical interests that cover a variety of styles. She also has proficiency in a number of languages. Susanna is looking forward to working with the Grace Choir on the same schedule they've been keeping and cultivating instrumentalists to play regularly.

We thank the search committee for their diligent work over the past four months: Cathy Farrell, chair, with Barb Hess, Bob Reilly, Ken Seiler, and Harold Schaefer.

Please plan to be here on January 5 for Susanna's first Sunday and to greet her at a reception following the 10:30 service. Welcome, Susanna!
