From the Pastor: True Love and the Christian Life



Part I: True love

We love because he first loved us. (1 John 4:19)

Valentine's Day is on the horizon. Love is in the air. One of my favorite things to do at this time of year is to pour myself a handful of little candy conversation hearts and skim through them looking for cute phrases. My all-time fave so far: "Adorbz."



Maybe among all the BFFs and TTYLs you'll even find this old-fashioned one: "True Love."

On Valentine's Day this may evoke images of roses and chocolate. But *true* love, that is, love that comes from God, lies at the heart of the Christian life. Without it, as Paul said, we are merely a noisy gong or clanging cymbal (unless you're in Mahler symphony, in which case your clanging has great purpose).



The capacity for free choice is the clearest sign of true love from God's perspective, because God trusts that we *will* choose to return it. From our perspective, though, this is where our trouble begins. The devil tempts us to deny God's true love in endless ways, and—imperfect creatures that we are—we keep falling for this trickery. "I will never be good enough to do this." "I don't deserve to have that." "So and so says they want to be my friend, but they must have some ulterior motive, for how could they really want to be with someone who can't ever seem to get it right?" "Why bother even trying, because I know I'll fail no matter what?"



We cannot love, truly, until we say "yes" to the love God is pouring down over and through us. That is, until we accept that God truly loves us *just as we are* with the vastness of the love that fuels the entire cosmos. Only that will enable us to embrace the truth of 1 John 4:19.

I agree – it's a challenge to accept this truth. Nonetheless, try opening your heart to that reality. For, as theologian Joseph Sittler memorably put it, "Unless and until the love with which I love finds its proper object in the love with which I am loved by God, I am a prisoner of love too small for love's heavenly nature and scope."

Part II: The Christian Life

Don't ask what the world needs. Ask what makes you come alive, and go do it. Because what the world needs is people who have come alive. (Howard Thurman)

Experiencing God's true love through Jesus Christ is to be born again into the fullness of life. But this is not just an individual experience; it is one that awaits this church, Grace Lutheran, as the body of Christ with all its variety of gifts.

Howard Thurman (1899-1981) was a profoundly influential mystic, author, educator, and voice of social and racial justice. He has much to tell us about the fullness of life. In what was to be his final commencement address at Boston University, Thurman urged people to discover in themselves what he called "the sound of the genuine" -- that is, to listen through the noise of their own ambitions and worldly desires for the sound of their own uniqueness as a new creation in Christ.

"There is something in every one of you that waits, listens for the sound of the genuine in yourself," Thurman said. "And if you cannot hear it, you will never find whatever it is for which you are searching, and if you hear it and then do not follow it, it was better that you had never been born."

This applies to communities as well. It is not enough to go from one month to the next, one year to the next, assuming things will continue exactly as they've been – because they won't. Instead, ask: What is the sound of the genuine for Grace Lutheran Church? What is the distinctive vocation of this gathering of faithful people? How can you, the people of Grace, learn to identify the intersection where your deepest desire meets the world's deepest need? And if you can name that, is it different from where you were 25 years ago? In that event, does the church need a new mission statement to lead you on?

"New" is the word so far for 2025. The Grace Council now has new officers, a new treasurer and for the first time in years, a youth representative. New ideas are percolating, new initiatives are springing up, new pathways are being laid down. New relationships are forming both inside and outside the church. Where will this take Grace and what part will each of you play? What works and what doesn't? How can you learn to listen for the sound of the genuine?

Not only will these new ideas carry you into the future, they will help forge a dynamic new personality and a new vocation for Grace Lutheran Church. "If the conditions for growth and development are met, then growth and development flow automatically," Howard Thurman said elsewhere. "This is the kind of responsive, dynamic, living, throbbing universe that honors the mind and the spirit which, together, can say one thing—and be that."
