The purpose of gathering for Breakfast Church is for us to connect with God, connect with one another, and grow together as the people of God. **We at Grace Church are one team!** We pull together and seek to learn from each other; we find ways to be the church better together, and we carry each other's burdens. We see and honor God's image in one another and know that very often, God shows up to us in the face of people around us.

We hope that by gathering as Breakfast Church, we will form deeper connections with one another, seeing God's grace shine through those around us and even seeing ourselves in a new light as we go through this time of transition together.

The physical setup of Breakfast Church will feature seating around tables instead of chairs lined up and all facing forward. This will help us align with our shared goals. Our format values and reflects the things we desire to see —hearing the voices of each one of us, not just one person talking up front; having ways for all to contribute —both to give and to receive.

There's a place at the table for **you**! Our children and teens are welcome to join us for our church family meal.

We encourage you to sign up – so we can reserve a place for you at the table. In the Narthex, there is a sign-up sheet – also indicating what food you will bring to share. If you're not a cook and breakfast casseroles aren't your thing, we also need juices, Danish, donuts, and fresh fruit. If you are away and will not be in the building between now and breakfast, you can call Lynn at <u>215-855-4676</u> and let her know how many will be in your party and what you plan to bring.

I am looking forward to having Breakfast Church with you on the 24th!

Breakfast Church Table Manners

We Agree:

That there may be some things that we disagree on. But as we sit down at Grace Breakfast Church, we choose to agree on this:

- I welcome you and your story, and I thank you for welcoming me and mine.
- I will show up, be open, and contribute to creating a compassionate space.
- As I speak and listen, I will show you respect, whether I agree or disagree with what's been shared.

At the table, we will:

- **Respect the dignity of every human being**—this includes one another, those who think differently in the wider community, and public figures
- **Keep it confidential.** Others' stories are not ours to share
- **Stick with "I" statements** ("I had an experience when...", "I feel..."). We honor and respect that your experience is yours and others' experiences are theirs.
- **Listen to each other and the Spirit**—listen to receive and understand, not to refute or plan a response.
- **Take space/make space**—Quieter people are encouraged to speak up as they feel comfortable; folks who typically talk more are encouraged to be self-aware, making space for others to share
- Agree to not "fix" other members of the group or give advice (unless asked for)

Let no corrupting talk come out of your mouths, but only such as is good for building up, as fits the occasion, that it may give grace to those who hear. (Ephesians 4:29, ESV)





Coming Soon: One Service every Sunday at 9:30!

After much discussion by both the Worship and Music Committee and Church Council, Council has voted to continue with a **single Sunday service after Labor Day.**Going to a single service enables us to worship together while

we work on our future plans. It will also make it easier for us to find supply pastors when needed. Starting at 9:30 gives our choir an opportunity to rehearse at 9:00. This is a temporary measure that will be readdressed once we have a settled pastor.

Spotlight on Giving In Service

The Giving In Service Team meets four times during the year to support local and global outreach initiatives. Our mission focuses on aiding agencies within our community and beyond, with ongoing projects supported by our congregation's generosity.

Current OUTreach projects:

- Laurel House: Provides assistance for women and children in Montgomery County. We support them through both our Valentine's Day and Mother's Day Carnations fundraisers.
- **Food Support**: During Lent, the **Rice Bowl Offering** benefits *The Food Cupboard* at Emmanuel Evangelical Congregational Church, Manna *on Main Street* in Lansdale, and the *World Hunger Appeal* through the Evangelical Lutheran Church of America.
- Harvest Home (September): Collecting food for The Hatfield Food Cupboard and Manna on Main Street.
- Crop Walk: Annual fundraising event in Lansdale for local and global causes.
- Adopt a Family: Supports Stepping Stones families. We purchase gift cards, gifts and food items for these families.
- We encourage year-round food donations and volunteering at the Hatfield Food Cupboard.
- Our latest outreach project: Bridge of Hope helps single moms struggling to avoid homelessness. It is a support system for these women to help them navigate through life challenges. Members of Grace would form a small group of 6 or 7 people who would like to be part of a support system for one woman.
