

The Holy Gospel: Luke 13:10-17

Now [Jesus] was teaching in one of the synagogues on the Sabbath.And just then there appeared a

woman with a spirit that had crippled her for eighteen years. She was bent over and was quite unable to stand up straight. ¹² When Jesus saw her, he called her over and said, "Woman, you are set free from your ailment." ¹³ When he laid his hands on her, immediately she stood up straight and began praising God. ¹⁴ But the leader of the synagogue, indignant because Jesus had cured on the Sabbath, kept saying to the crowd, "There are six days on which work ought to be done; come on those days and be cured and not on the Sabbath day." ¹⁵ But the Lord answered him and said, "You hypocrites! Does not each of you on the Sabbath untie his ox or his donkey from the manger and lead it to water? ¹⁶ And ought not this woman, a daughter of Abraham whom Satan bound for eighteen long years, be set free from this bondage on the Sabbath day?" ¹⁷ When he said this, all his opponents were put to shame, and the entire crowd was rejoicing at all the wonderful things being done by him.

Do this for the remembrance of me.


With this bread and cup we remember our Lord's passover from death to life as we proclaim the mystery of faith:


Lord, remember us in your kingdom and teach us to pray.

The Communion at the table: Every table has pre-poured cups of wine and cubed Gluten Free Bread to share at the table. The person taking the platter will commune the person on their right – giving them the bread and **saying the Body of Christ given for you.** Then the wine is given, **saying The Blood of Christ shed for you.** The person who just received the communion will then commune with the person to their right.
